





Remember when teachers covered your keyboard so that you could memorize letter position on keyboards? They are back, but in a much more 21st century way! Students at Chantry are trying out Keyboarding Online - a program that keeps track of their speeds and words per minute. The interesting part is that once the students start typing - the letters they type are covered up. If they happen to look down at the keyboard - they only have 2 seconds before the screen blanks and they have to start over again! They eventually learn that keeping a steady pace, and actually remembering the keys will work! We have a few students that still insist on hunting and pecking but it will catch up with them.
